Prof. Dr. Jens Biegert has been elected as fellow of the [American Physical Society](#) for 2019. The distinct honor is bestowed on less than 0.5 percent of the society's membership each year.

APS Fellowship recognizes members that have completed exceptional physics research, identified innovative applications of physics to science and technology, or furthered physics education. Nominated by their peers, he was selected based on his outstanding contributions to his field.

Jens Biegert is ICREA Professor of Attoscience and Ultrafast Optics at ICFO. He was nominated by the APS Division of Atomic, Molecular, and Optical Physics (DAMOP) **for the development of intense few-cycle mid-infrared sources for the generation of water-wind w high-order harmonics, and their use in fundamental space-time imaging of the dynamics**
